In our science topic, we found out how water is transported in a plant. We learned how transpiration and capillary action draws water up the stem. We found these practical demonstrations of capillary action fascinating.

In Sparrowhawks class this week, as part of our science about the Earth and Space, we had fun making and measuring craters! We worked in groups and thought carefully about the different variables that may affect the size of a crater. We thought about the height from which the meteor was dropped, the angle it hit the earth at, the mass of the meteor and also the density of the ground that it was hitting. We thought carefully about how we were going to record our results in a table and then used the data to generate a graph. We showed great team work and worked really hard in our groups to gather our results.
