We will begin our dragon-themed poetry writing next week, which will be really exciting.

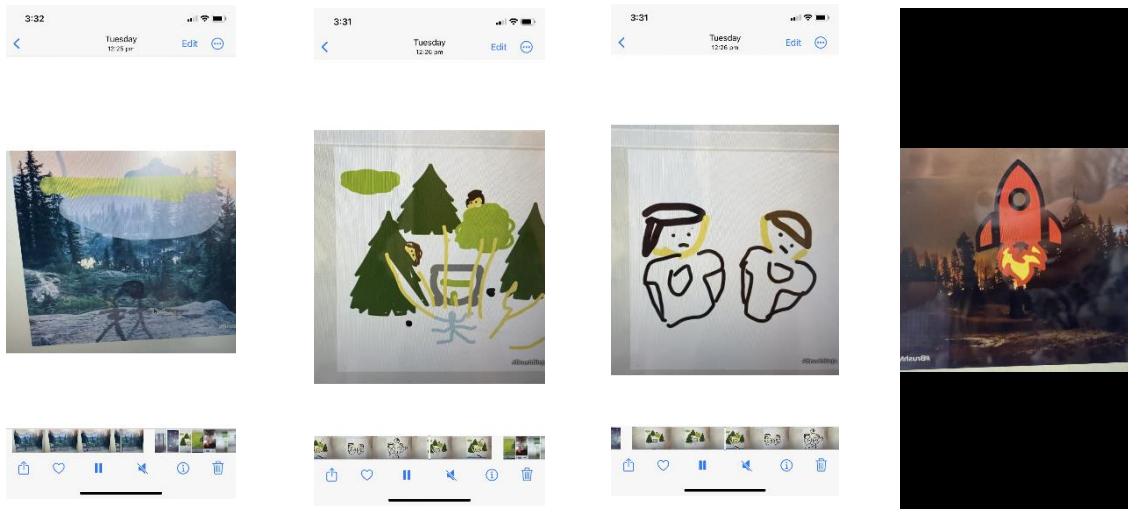

Together, we looked deeply at a modelled example, identifying the key features, language used and created a success criteria. We then had a great discussion around different topics we could 'argue' in our writing. We had suggestions such as:

Should animals be kept in captivity?  
Should products be tested on animals?  
Climate change: Are the government doing enough?

All of the children have chosen an area that they are passionate about, which has made it interesting and challenging for them to ensure that the arguments are balanced! They have all got off to a great start and we are looking forward to reading their final drafts.
