Owls

What a fantastic start our new Owls have made to life at Randwick. They have spent the last week making new friends, exploring the school site, visiting our forest school area and getting to know their Year 6 buddies.





Each week in our Celebration Worship on a Friday, we would like to invite our budding musicians to play. When the children returned to Buzzards, it was wonderful to see how much they had grown and how happy they all were. They have successfully adjusted to our routines and classroom environment.

We've had lots of reflective discussions around developing a 'Growth Mindset' and they have shown all of our school values this week, in particular compassion. The children are so kind and caring to one another it has been wonderful to see.

They've thoroughly enjoyed their first Forest School lesson looking for autumnal cues and in English enjoyed the story 'The Proudest Blue'.

We are so pleased with how quickly they have adapted to Buzzards, and we are eagerly anticipating the upcoming school year!

Kestrels

What an amazing first week back we've had! Kestrels have dived straight into our topic by asking the question 'How did people survive prehistory?' We've created art about Stonehenge, explored some fantastic flint tools from Stroud Museum and immersed ourselves in some Stone Age inspired books. The children are really enjoying reading Stig of the Dump and Stone Age Boy. You might enjoy borrowing your own copy from the library and reading along at home.













In Hawks class we have had a tremendous start to the academic year and all the children have displayed fantastic learning behaviours.

In Maths, we have been tackling our place value units; we have interpreted numbers made from place value columns and base to and recognised the value of digits in numbers with up to 7 digits. In English, we have begun our newspaper unit of writing. We have looked at the features of the genre and some grammar that we must include. To support our writing, we had to experience a discovery and did this by finding some ancient roman coins that had been buried on the school site.
