We have worked as artists, scientists, and historians, just to name a few. The children at Forest School have been refining their sawing techniques while examining the various leaf colours. We are also working hard on perfecting our harvest song.





Kestrels

This week, Kestrel Class have survived the Stone Age! We had a zoom meeting with a historian from Stroud Museum to ask her questions and find out about inventions that helped people survive. We also created dances to represent the key changes throughout the Stone Age. You might like to ask your children about this time and what was invented by Paleolithic, Mesolithic and Neolithic people. Next week, we will be asking the question, "Was it easier to survive the Bronze Age?"



Hawks

In Hawks class, we have been industrious with our learning and have used vast amounts of perseverance.

In Maths, we have continued with our place value unit and understanding numbers; we have compared and ordered numbers as well as rounding numbers to the nearest 1000,10,000 and 100,000.

In English, we have focussed on creating our own newspaper reports on the discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb made by Howard Carter. We have been researching pharaohs in history and the impact that they had on ancient Egypt.

In Science, we have created our simple circuits and have planned our own investigations into how to make a bulb brighter.
