Dear Parents and Carers,

A warm welcome to all our new parents and carers who have joined our school community this year, and welcome back to everyone else! Forest School

We are organising this differently this year to ensure children build on skills week by week. For our children in reception and y1, this will be weekly (reception on Wednesday morning and y1 on Thursday morning, starting next week). For the children in y 3 – 6, they will have a half term (around 6 – 8 weeks) of Forest School sessions on a Friday, as part of the PE curriculum. For y2 children, they will have two half term's of Forest School sessions. The first year group for Forest School is y3 so next Friday they need to come to school in the Forest School clothes. Details to follow next week on what to wear and when. Y4 will be after half term.

Volunteers

As always you are very warmly invited to help in school with tasks ranging from managing the library, hearing children read, help with special days and Forest School sessions. We will leave a clipboard outside the office for Forest School sessions (these can only run if we have support from parents) and volunteering. We desperately need someone to join our yoga teacher on Friday afternoons in the church from 2 – 3. She will be taking a Randwick Runway group each term so all children should have at least 6 weeks of yoga.

Randwick Runway

We start on Friday from 2 – 3pm and have changed one group. We will still have the café, Eco-Schools group, art and crafts group, Randwick Worship group and the Randwick Runner group (reintroduced this year, our School Magazine), but new this year is the Yoga group, being led by Robin Watkins from 'Bliss by Robin' Yoga. We hope this can happen in the church but need a volunteer – please sign up if you can!

Homework

Homework will be set from next week with online tasks on *mathletics* (an online programme we subscribe to; we will reissue logins for children next week) for maths and a half termly project based on the topic (history, geography or computing). We are continuing to support children to learn their times tables and would urge you to help us with this at home: there are lots of activities on *mathletics* you might also like to sign up to rock star times table. All children are now expected to learn their times tables to 12 by end of y4 and this year's y4 children will be the first year to formally sit the government's Multiplication Tables Check in June 2020.

Coming in in the morning

Last term I let you know about a change to how we settle children first thing. This week children have come in from 08.35 and gone straight to classes. This has ensured a calmer start and a less frenetic entrance through the back door. We are going to continue for the half term but on Fridays children will stay on the playground for the fun run. I (or another member of staff) will be at the back gate and you can of course talk to me then or arrange to meet if you need longer. You can contact the office to arrange a meeting with teachers or speak to them at the end of the day. We are responsible for your child once they are in school (anytime from 08.35, or if they are breakfast club, from 08.00) but as I am not on the playground, we cannot be responsible for children there. Parents are of course welcome to meet on the playground and send children in at 08.45. We will review again at half term but feedback from staff and children suggest this has benefits to us at this time.

Finish times

To help children leave more easily, we are dismissing our Owl and Buzzard classes at 15.10 and our Kestrel and Sparrowhawk classes at 15.15. Sparrowhawks will leave via the back door. Children from y4 upwards can walk home on their own but please let us know if your child is going to be doing this.
