Admission Information

Published Admission Number and Previous Applications

The Published Admission Number is the total number of pupils that the school can admit into Reception (or Year 3 for Junior Schools). We have also included for each school the total number of pupils in the school so you can gauge its size. The number of total preferences and first preferences will also help you to see how oversubscribed a school is, as this will tell you how many parents had named a school as one of their preferences on their application form and how many of these had placed it as their first preference.

Admission Policy

Admission policies are set by the Admission Authority for the school (the Local Authority for Community & Voluntary Controlled Schools and the Governing Body for Free, Trust, Foundation, Academies & Voluntary Aided Schools) and are applied for new children entering a school. We have included each school's admission policy, so you are aware before applying for a school place. This will include whether the school has a supplementary information form that you may need to complete and how to obtain this. Each school's admission policy is available from Determined admission criteria and scheme for 2026 Gloucestershire County Council, the school itself, or the school's website. The admission policy for all Community and Voluntary Controlled schools can be found on page 4.

Oversubscription Criteria

If a school receives more preferences than places available, the Admission Authority will place all children in the order in which they could be considered for a place. This will strictly follow the priority order of their oversubscription criteria.

Oversubscription Criteria and Admission Policy

For Community and Voluntary Controlled Schools

Primary and Infant schools

Where applications for admission exceed the number of places available, the following criteria will be applied, in the order set out below, to decide which children to admit:

- * A 'looked after child' or a child who was previously looked after but immediately after being looked after became subject to an adoption; child arrangements order or special guardianship order. (See page 10 for definition)
- * Children who will have siblings attending the school at the time the applicant child is admitted. (See page 10 for definition) In the case of infant schools a sibling connection is also established if an older child is attending the companion junior school.
- * Children with the strongest geographical claim, measured in a straight line from the ordnance survey address point of the child's home address (including flats) to the ordnance survey address point of the school, using the Local Authority's computerised measuring system, with those living closer to the school receiving the higher priority.

Where points 1 and 2 are oversubscribed, criterion 3 (strongest geographical claim based on straight line distance) will be used to determine which child is offered a place.

In the event of a tie between two or more children when applying criterion 3 (strongest geographical claim based on straight line distance) where there are not enough places available to offer all children a place at the school, a process of random allocation will be followed by the Local Authority.

This is a manual process which is overseen by an independent person from the Legal Services Team.



Junior schools

All Community and Voluntary Controlled junior schools use the following criteria to admit children into Year 3:

Where applications for admission exceed the number of places available, the following criteria will be applied, in the order set out below, to decide which children to admit:


- * A 'looked after child' or a child who was previously looked after but immediately after being looked after became subject to an adoption; child arrangements order or special guardianship order. (See page 10 for definition)
- * In the case of companion infant and junior schools, priority will be given to pupils attending the companion infant school.
- * Children who will have siblings attending the school at the time the applicant child is admitted.
- * Children who will have siblings attending the companion infant school at the time the applicant child is admitted. (See page 10 for definition)
- * Children with the strongest geographical claim, measured in a straight line from the ordnance survey point of the child's home to an ordnance survey point of the school/academy, using the Local Authority's computerised measuring system, with those living closer to the school receiving the higher priority.

Where any particular category at points 1-4 above is oversubscribed, criterion 5 (strongest geographical claim based on straight line distance) will be used to determine which child is offered a place.

In the event of a tie between two or more children when applying criterion 5 (strongest geographical claim based on straight line distance) where there are not enough places available to offer all children a place at the school, a process of random allocation will be followed by the Local Authority. This is a manual process which is overseen by an independent person from the Legal Services Team.




School Location Maps













Criteria Definitions

Looked After Children / Previously Looked After Children

A looked after child' (1) or a child who was previously looked after but immediately after being looked after became subject to an adoption (2) child arrangements order (residency order) (3) or special guardianship order (4).

- (1) A 'looked after child' is a child who is (a) in the care of a local authority, or (b) being provided with accommodation by a local authority in the exercise of their social services functions (see the definition in Section 22(1) of the Children Act 1989) at the time of making an application to a school. In Gloucestershire, such children are referred to as Children in Care.
- (2) This includes children who were adopted under the Adoption Act 1976 (see Adoption Act, Section 12, Adoption Orders), children who were adopted under the Adoption and Children's Act 2002 (see Adoption and Children's Act, Section 46, Adoption Orders) and children who appear (to the admission authority) to have been in state care outside of England and ceased to be in state care as a result of being adopted
- (3) Under the provisions of s.12 of the Children and Families Act 2014, which amend section 8 of the Children Act 1989, residence orders have now been replaced by child arrangements orders.
- (4) See Section 14A of the Children Act 1989 which defines a 'special guardianship order' as an order appointing one or more individuals to be a child's special guardian (or special guardians).

Sibling

Unless otherwise stated in the individual school criteria sibling refers to brother or sister, half brother or sister, adopted brother or sister, step brother or sister, or the child of the parent/carer's partner as well as children who are brought together as a family by a same sex civil partnership. In every case, the child must be living in the same family unit at the same address. The older child must be continuing to attend when the younger child is admitted.

In the case of infant schools unless otherwise stated in the school criteria a sibling connection is also established if an older child will be or is already attending the companion junior school.

- 1. Looked after children or previously looked after children.
- 2. Children who have siblings attending the school and who will continue to do so when the younger child is admitted. For this purpose, sibling refers to brother or sister, half brother or sister, adopted brother or sister, step brother or sister, or the child of the parent/carer's partner as well as children who are brought together as a family by a same sex civil partnership. In every case, the child must be living in the same family unit at the same address, at the time of application.
 - Only one home address can be used for admission purposes. This is where the pupil resides, and we may ask for additional proof of this address. Where a child lives with both parents on a 50/50 (equal) basis, both parents must agree which of their addresses to use and confirm this before any closing dates. This must be either parental home. Additional proof of address may be requested before we can confirm that we are able to use an address for allocation purposes. The method in which the distance is measured from home to school can be found in the admission criteria.
- 3. Children who have a parent who is a member of staff at the school and who will continue to do so when the child joins the school roll. A child is defined as a son or daughter, step son or daughter, adopted son or daughter or the child of the parent/carer's partner, and in every case, the child must be living in the same family unit at the same address. A member of staff is defined as anyone who is employed at the school. Priority will be given to children of staff in either or both of the following circumstances: a) where the member of staff has been employed at the school for two or more years at the time at which the application for admission to the school is made; and/or b) the member of staff is recruited to fill a vacant post at the school for which there is a demonstrable skill shortage*
- 4. Children with the strongest geographical claim, measured in a straight line from the Ordnance Survey address point of the child's home address (including flats) to the Ordnance Survey address point of the school, using the Local Authority's computerised measuring system, with those living closer to the school receiving the higher priority.

*At first Board of Trustees meeting of each academic year, the Trust Board will receive information from the CEO about the current subject or skills shortage for the school.

Where any particular category at points 1-3 above is oversubscribed, criterion 4 (strongest geographical claim based on straight line distance) will be used to determine which child is offered a place.

In the event of a tie between two or more children when applying criterion 4 (strongest geographical claim based on straight line distance) where there are not enough places available to offer all children a place at the school, a process of random allocation will be followed by the DGAT. This will be in the form of a manual process which is overseen by an independent person from the Trust Board or its delegated authority. Where twins or children from multiple births are part of a random allocation process they will be considered as one applicant.

- 2. Children who have a sibling attending the school and who will continue to do so when the younger child is admitted. For this purpose, sibling refers to brother or sister, half brother or sister, adopted brother or sister, stepbrother or sister, or the child of the parent/carer's partner as well as children who are brought together as a family by a same sex civil partnership. In every case, the child must be living in the same family unit at the same address, at the time of application.
- 3. Children of families living in the ecclesiastical parishes of Ampney Crucis, Ampney St. Peter, and Ampney St. Mary, Driffield, Harnhill and Poulton, Barnsley, and Down Ampney. For more information on the parishes please see the Parish website: http://ampney.info/vicar/Home.html
- 4. Children of families whose parents are active members of a local Church of England church in the above parishes, but who do not live in the above parishes. We define a family (a parent and child) to be active members of the church if the family attends church at least 6 times a year. A letter of support from the minister will be required.
- 5. Children of families whose parents are active members of a local church that is a member of Churches Together in England, in the above parishes, but who do not live in the above parishes. We define a family to be active members of the church if the family attends church at least 6 times a year. A letter of support from the minister will be required.
- 6. Children of families who live outside the above parishes.

In the event of over-subscription in any of the categories above, places will be offered to children with the strongest geographical claim, measured in a straight line from the ordnance survey point of the child's home address (including flats) to the ordnance point of the school, using the Local authority's computerised measuring system, with those living closer to the school receiving higher priority.

Tie-Break Situation

Where any particular category at points 1-6 is over-subscribed, criterion 7 (strongest geographical claim based on straight line distance) will be used to determine which child will be offered a place.

In the event of a tie between two or more children when applying criterion 7 where there are not enough places available to offer all children a place at the school, a process of random allocation will be followed by the Governing Body.

- 1. Looked after children or previously looked after children.
- 2. A child with one or more sibling already attending the school. A sibling is a brother or sister, half-brother or half-sister, adopted brother or adopted sister, step brother or step sister, or the child of the parent's/carer's partner. The child should be living in the same family unit at the same address. The older child must be continuing to attend Andoversford Primary School when the younger child is admitted.
- 3. Geographical claim. Places will be allocated to children with the strongest geographical claim, measured in a straight line from the 'Ordnance Survey Point' of the children's home address to the 'Ordnance Survey Point' in the school. The measurement will be taken using the Local Authorities computerised measuring system, with those living closest to the school, receiving highest priority.

- 1. Looked after children or previously looked after children.
- 2. Children who will have siblings attending the school at the time the applicant child is admitted. For this purpose, sibling refers to brother or sister, half brother or sister, adopted brother or sister, step brother or sister, or the child of the parent/carer's partner as well as children who are brought together as a family by a same sex civil partnership. In every case, the child must be living in the same family unit at the same address, at the time of application. Where a child lives with both parents on a 50/50 (equal) basis, both parents must agree and confirm the pupil's address, which must be the same address as the preference school has registered for the sibling connection to apply. The parents' agreement and application must be made before the closing dates in order for the sibling connection to apply.
- 3. Children who have a parent who is a permanent member of staff at the Primary QuEST school (the school they would like their child to attend) and who will continue to do so when the child is admitted. A child is defined as a son or daughter, step son or daughter, adopted son or daughter or the child of the parent/carer's partner, and in every case, the child must be living in the same family unit at the same address.
- 4. Children with the strongest geographical claim, measured in a straight line from the Ordnance Survey address point of the child's home address (including flats) to the Ordnance Survey address point of the school, using the Local Authority's computerised measuring system, with those living closer to the school receiving the higher priority.

Where any particular category at points 1-3 above is oversubscribed, criterion 4 (strongest geographical claim based on straight line distance) will be used to determine which child is offered a place.

In the event of a tie between two or more children when applying criterion 4 (strongest geographical claim based on straight line distance) where there are not enough places available to offer all children a place at the school, a process of random allocation will be followed by Primary QuEST. This will be in the form of a manual process which is overseen by an independent person from the Trust Board or its delegated authority. Where twins or children from multiple births are part of a random allocation process they will be considered as one applicant.

Admissions Policy

- 1. Looked after children or previously looked after children.
- 2. Children who will have siblings attending the school when the additional child is admitted. We follow the Local Authority's definition of a sibling as 'a brother or sister, half-brother or sister, adopted brother or sister, step brother or sister, or the child of the parent's/carer's partner, and in every case, the child must be living in the same family unit at the same address.' Where a child lives with both parents on a 50/50 (equal) basis, the local authority will use the address of the parent who is in receipt of the child benefit for allocation purposes. The local authority reserves the right to request further information to clarify the child's permanent home address.
- 3. Children with the strongest geographical claim, measured in a direct line from the 'Ordnance Survey Address Point' of the school, using the Local Authority's computerised measuring system, with those living closer to the school receiving the highest priority. Ease of access to the school or other schools will be taken into consideration.

In the event of over-subscription in any particular category, we will follow the procedure: 'Where any particular category points 1-2 are over-subscribed criterion 3 (strongest geographical claim based on straight line distance) will be used to determine which child will by offered a place. In the event of a tie between two or more children when applying criterion 3 (strongest geographical claim based on a straight line distance) where there are not enough places available to offer all children a place at the school, a process of random allocation will be followed by the Local Governing Body.

- 1. Looked after children or previously looked after children.
- 2. Children who have a sibling who will be attending Aylburton C. of E. Primary School at the time of reception admission (i.e. a brother or sister, half brother or sister, adopted brother or sister, step

brother or sister, or the child of a parent/carer's partner). The older child must be continuing to attend the school when the younger child is admitted and in every case the child must be living in the same family unit at the same address.

- 3. Children with an authenticated medical reason for attending the school. Children for whom only this particular school is appropriate due to an exceptional medical condition. Applications will only be considered if supported by a written statement from the applicant's doctor which must demonstrate that there is a very specific connection between the medical need and the facilities or resources of the school. The final decision to accept a child under this category will be made by the Board of Trustees through consultation with relevant professionals where necessary.
- 4. Children of members of staff: (a) If the member of staff has been employed at Aylburton C of E Primary School for two or more years at the time the of the application being made, (b) if the member of staff is recruited to fill a vacant post of which there is a demonstrable skill shortage.
- 5. Children with the strongest geographical claim in the year in which the child is to start school on the closing date for applications. The distance will be measured in a straight line from the ordnance survey point of the child's home address (including flats) to the ordnance survey point of the school. Those living the closest will receive the higher priority.

Where any particular category at points 1-4 above is oversubscribed, criterion 5 (the strongest geographical claim based on straight line distance) will be used to determine which child is offered a place.

In the event of a tie between two or more children, when applying criterion 5, the strongest geographical claim will be measured in a straight line from the ordinance survey point from the child's home address (including flats) to the ordinance survey address point of the school using the Local Authority's computerised measuring system with those living closer to the school receiving the higher priority.

Where there are not enough places available to offer all children a place at the school, a process of random allocation will be followed by English Bicknor & Aylburton Local Academy Committee. This process will be overseen by an independent person.

For this purpose, the term 'sibling' refers to brother or sister, half brother or sister, adopted brother or sister, step brother or sister, or the child of the parent/carer's partner, as well as children who are brought together as a family by a same sex civil partnership. In every case, the child must be living in the same family unit at the same address, at the time of application
- 3. Children who attend St. Lawrence, Barnwood with at least one parent who, over at least two years prior to application for a place at the school, has been committed to the worshipping life of St. Lawrence Church, Barnwood. *
- 4. Children living in the ecclesiastical Parish of Barnwood who attend with at least one parent, and who, over at least two years prior to application, has been committed to the worshipping life of another Church or Christian fellowship subscribing to the historic creeds. *
- 5. Children with the strongest geographical claim, measured in a straight line from the ordnance survey address point of the child's home address (including flats) to the ordnance survey address point of the school, using the Local Authority's computerised measuring system, with those living closer to the school receiving the higher priority.

Where any particular category at points 1-4 above is oversubscribed, criterion 5 (strongest geographical claim based on straight line distance) will be used to determine which child is offered a place.

In the event of a tie between two or more children when applying criterion 5 (strongest geographical claim based on straight line distance) where there are not enough places available to offer all children a place at the school, a process of random allocation will be followed by the Local Authority. This will be in the form of a manual process which is overseen by an independent person from the Council's Legal Services. Where twins or children from multiple births are part of a random allocation process, they will be considered as one applicant.

For criteria 3 and 4 parents should submit the relevant form signed by their Vicar or Minister (and previous Minister if new to the area). The form will need to clearly state whether or not the parents fulfil the criteria for Church commitment. By 'committed to the worshipping life' of the Church the Governors mean attendance should be at least once a month over a period of two years prior to application.

*In the event that during the period specified for attendance at worship the church [or, in relation to those of other faiths, relevant place of worship] has been closed for public worship and has not provided alternative premises for that worship, the requirements of these [admissions] arrangements in relation to attendance will only apply to the period when the church [or in relation to those of other faiths, relevant place of worship] or alternative premises have been available for public worship.)

- 1. Catholic looked after and previously looked after children.

- 7. Children of another Christian denomination whose membership is evidenced by a minister of religion. children of other Christian denominations" means children who belong to other churches and ecclesial

communities which, acknowledge God's revelation in Christ, confess the Lord Jesus Christ as God and Saviour according to the Scriptures, and, in obedience to God's will and in the power of the Holy Spirit commit themselves: to seek a deepening of their communion with Christ and with one another in the Church, which is His body; and to fulfil their mission to proclaim the Gospel by common witness and service in the world to the glory of the one God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. An ecclesial community which on principle has no credal statements in its tradition, is included if it manifests faith in Christ as witnessed to in the Scriptures and is committed to working in the spirit of the above. All members of Churches Together in England and CYTÛN are deemed to be included in the above definition, as are all other churches and ecclesial communities that are in membership of any local Churches Together Group (by whatever title) on the above basis

- 8. Children of another faith whose membership is evidenced by a religious leader. Children of other faiths" means children who are members of a religious community that does not fall within the definition of 'other Christian denominations' at 6 above and which falls within the definition of a religion for the purposes of charity law. The Charities Act 2011 defines religion to include:
 - A religion which involves belief in more than one God, and
 - A religion which does not involve belief in a God.

Case law has identified certain characteristics which describe the meaning of religion for the purposes of charity law, which are characterised by a belief in a supreme being and an expression of belief in that supreme being through worship.

9. Any other children

Within each of the oversubscription categories listed above, the following provisions will be applied in the following order.

- (i) Children who will have a brother or sister at the school at the time of enrolment. The attendance of a brother or sister at the school at the time of enrolment will increase the priority of an application within each category so that the application will be placed above those without a brother or sister attending the school, within the category in which the application is made.

Random Allocation

If you do not provide the information required in the SIF and return it by the closing date for the first round of allocations, together with all supporting documentation as appropriate, your child may not be placed in criteria categories 1 to 3 or 5 to 8, and this may affect your child's chance of being offered a

place. All applications which are submitted on time will be considered at the same time and after the closing date for admissions which is 15 January 2026.

Within each of the oversubscription categories listed above, the following provisions will be applied in the following order.

- (i) Children who will have a brother or sister at the school at the time of enrolment. The attendance of a brother or sister at the school at the time of enrolment will increase the priority of an application within each category so that the application will be placed above those without a brother or sister attending the school, within the category in which the application is made.
- (ii) Children of a member of St Mary's Catholic Primary School staff who has been employed at the school for two or more consecutive years at the time of application, or who was recruited to fill a vacant post for which there is a demonstrable skills shortage. This does not include staff who work on the school site for other employers.

Tie Break

Where children have identical ranking, priority within each category will then be determined by random allocation (see below).

Random Allocation

Each child will be allocated a number. These numbers are shared with a person independent of the school who will supervise the process. Governors will then use a random number generator to rank the numbers. For children of a multiple birth, the order created by the random number generator, will be overridden to place all the children from the multiple birth together at the place where the highest child (from the multiple birth) is ranked. The random number generator will then be used to rank the children from the multiple birth. This process will also be applied to brothers or sisters who are not from a multiple birth but are applying for a place in the same year group.

Notes

• 'Catholic' means a member of a Church in full communion with the See of Rome. This includes the Eastern Catholic Churches. This will normally be evidenced by a certificate of baptism in a Catholic Church or a certificate of reception into the full communion of the Catholic Church. For the purposes of this policy, it includes a looked after child living with a family where at least one of the parents is Catholic

For a child to be treated as Catholic, evidence of Catholic baptism or reception into the Church will be required. Whilst a copy of the certificate may be accepted, the admission authority may request sight of the original. The admission authority may also request additional supporting evidence if the written documents that are provided do not confirm the fact that the person was baptised/received into a Catholic Church.

There may occasionally be difficulty in obtaining written evidence of baptism or reception into the Church. In such cases, contact may be made with a Parish Priest for advice on how the question of baptism/reception is to be resolved and how written evidence is to be produced in accordance with the law of the Church. The Priest may seek advice from Clifton Dioceseafter child living with a family where at least one of the parents is confirmed as being Catholic.

- 'Catechumen' means a member of the catechumenate of a Catholic Church. This will normally be evidenced by a certificate of reception into the order of catechumens.
- 'Eastern Christian Church' includes Orthodox Churches, and is normally evidenced by a certificate of baptism or reception from the authorities of that Church.
- Children of other Christian denominations" means children who belong to other churches and ecclesial communities which, acknowledge God's revelation in Christ, confess the Lord Jesus Christ as God and Saviour according to the Scriptures, and, in obedience to God's will and in the power of the Holy Spirit commit themselves: to seek a deepening of their communion with Christ and with one another in the Church, which is His body; and to fulfil their mission to proclaim the Gospel by common witness and service in the world to the glory of the one God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. An ecclesial community which on principle has no credal statements in its tradition, is included if it manifests faith in Christ as witnessed to in the Scriptures and is committed to working in the spirit of the above.

All members of Churches Together in England and CYTÛN are deemed to be included in the above definition, as are all other churches and ecclesial communities that are in membership of any local Churches Together Group (by whatever title) on the above basis.

• "Children of other faiths" means children who are members of a religious community that does not fall within the definition of 'other Christian denominations' at 6 above and which falls within

the definition of a religion for the purposes of charity law. The Charities Act 2011 defines religion to include:

- A religion which involves belief in more than one God, and
- A religion which does not involve belief in a God.

Case law has identified certain characteristics which describe the meaning of religion for the purposes of charity law, which are characterised by a belief in a supreme being and an expression of belief in that supreme being through worship.

- 'Brother or sister' includes:
 - (i) all natural brothers or sisters, half brothers or sisters, adopted brothers or sisters, stepbrothers or sisters, foster brothers or sisters, whether or not they are living at the same address; and
 - (ii) the child of a parent's partner where that child lives for at least part of the week in the same family unit at the same home address as the child who is the subject of the application.
- A 'parent' means all natural parents, any person who is not a parent but has parental responsibility for a child, and any person who has care of a child.
- A child's "home address" refers to the address where the child usually lives with a parent or carer, and will be the address provided in the Common Application Form ("CAF"). Where parents have shared responsibility for a child, and the child lives for part of the week with each parent, the home address will be the address given in the CAF, provided that the child resides at that address for any part of the school week.
