#### **Staffing**

Laura will be working on Mondays, Tuesdays and Fridays initially, and then every morning after half term.

# Helping Little People with Big Emotions: part of our Facts4Life programme

You will have seen the message on School Spider about the parents' workshop above for parents only (there is a crèche available for children) happening on Monday after school, 3:20 – 4:20pm. The session covers how the mind and body respond to triggers and how we can help our children (and ourselves) to manage these difficult feelings and sensations. I have been to something similar at my children's school with Pete Kirby, one of the practitioners running the session from GHLL (Gloucestershire Healthy Living and Learning team), and it was excellent. Bringing up children is not easy; this might provide some support!

Facts4Life is a joint initiative between health and education which aims to empower children with the knowledge, skills and attitudes that they need in order to support their health and wellbeing.

#### **After-School Provision**

I have explored options but been unable to find an organization prepared to take this on, partly due to numbers, partly due to a lack of space. #### **School Dinners Price**

We said we would report back at the end of the term on numbers and whether we can afford to reduce the cost of meals. When we started cooking our own meals on site we set a price which enabled us to offset costs with existing numbers. Since we started the Fly High Cafe, numbers have increased but we need an average of 55 meals per day to break even. The average number of children per day who had lunch from September to December last year was 55. We are not therefore able at this time to reduce dinner costs without running at a loss but if numbers increase we will be able to reduce the price. We will review again at the end of March and hopefully be able to set a lower price come the summer term. Mr Poad
