

# Wonderful Weather

## Vocabulary:

**Temperature** A degree of hotness and coldness which can be measured.

**Weather** The way the air and atmosphere feels. It includes the outside temperature, strength of the wind, and whether it is raining, sunny, hailing, snowing, sleeting, foggy or cloudy.

**Climate** The average weather conditions in a place over 30 years or more.

**Equator** An imaginary circle around the Earth. It divides Earth into two equal parts: the Northern Hemisphere and the Southern Hemisphere.

**Weather vane** An instrument used to indicate wind direction.

**Rain gauge** An instrument used to measure rain in millimetres or inches.

**Thermometer** An instrument for measuring temperature.

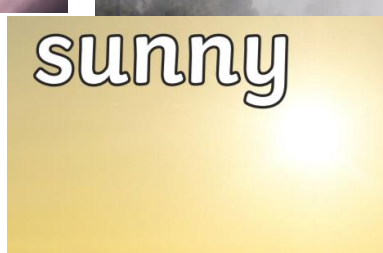
