## Home-school agreement for children returning to school in term 6

Parents and Carers
<b>Being ready for school:</b>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• My child will come to school wearing clean clothes (comfortable, flexible clothes suitable for PE and Forest School) each day, with short and clean nails, a named water bottle and named hand sanitiser (replaced or refilled when necessary).</li></ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• In the event of rain, they will wear a named coat which will be kept in their classroom.</li></ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• In the event of hot weather, I will apply suncream to my child before they come to school, and provide a named hat, which they will keep on their peg.</li></ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• I will wash my child's water bottle daily so that it is clean when it comes to school.</li></ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• I will prepare a packed lunch for my child each day and my child will put this in the outside cupboard for their class at the start of each day. I will wash my child's lunchbox at home daily.</li></ul>
<b>Keeping safe</b>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• I will keep my child at home if they display any symptoms which might suggest COVID-19 (including, therefore, cold symptoms).</li></ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• I will ensure that if I am not able to collect my child within 30 minutes, that I have another contact available (should my child present as unwell).</li></ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• I will make sure my child is brought to school by one adult, and collected from school by one adult, within the 5 minute time slot, and I will take my child home straight away.</li></ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• I understand that I should walk, bike or travel in my own car to school. Please note the Safer Travel Guidance. <a href="#">Coronavirus (COVID-19): safer travel guidance for passengers</a></li></ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• I am committed to respecting the social distancing advice given by the Government to help protect all members of the school community, and our neighbours.</li></ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• I will reinforce to my child the importance of washing their hands for 20 seconds on a regular basis and show them how it is done.</li></ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• If my child is sent home with symptoms of COVID-19, I will take them to be tested, and let school know the outcome immediately.</li></ul>
<b>Communications</b>



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- Rather than speaking to office staff and coming into school, I will email or ring the school office if I need to make contact, or speak to my child's teacher at the beginning or end of the day.

## Staff and Governors

### Being ready for school:

- Staff will come to school in clean clothes each day, with short and clean nails, with a named hand sanitiser (replaced as and when necessary).
- Staff will ensure they are outside and ready to welcome children into school at the allotted time.
- Staff will ensure that your child's well-being is paramount and plan for activities to support good mental health and well-being.

### Keeping safe

- Staff will stay at home if they display any symptoms which might suggest COVID-19 (including, therefore, cold symptoms).
- We will look after your child if they display symptoms, check their temperature and inform you immediately.
- Staff are committed to respecting the social distancing advice given by the Government to help protect all members of the school community, and our neighbours.
- Staff will wash their hands for 20 seconds on a regular basis and show children in school how it is done.
- If staff are symptomatic, they will go to be tested, and let school know the outcome immediately.
- Visitors to school will be kept to an absolute minimum during school time.

### Communications

- Staff will communicate to parents either in person, on the phone or via email any issues relevant to their child. They will stay within the group 'bubble'.

### Monitoring

- Governors will monitor how we are educating children both in school and at home, by seeking feedback from staff, parents and children, outside of school.
