Illness

We recently emailed with details about what to do if your child presents as being unwell at home. In school, we will take your child's temperature, using a new infrared thermometer, if they become unwell in any way during the school day. Your child may look unwell, tell us they are feeling unwell or have a temperature. Normally, we would keep a child in school unless we were convinced they were unwell, but in the current situation we can't take any risks and will err on the side of caution. If your child presents with a persistent cough, a lack of taste/smell or a temperature above 37.8 degrees C, you should keep them home and get them tested by booking for a test centre or home kit online:

If they present in school with one of the above COVID-19 symptoms, we will isolate them, stay with them and ring you.

It is vital that we are able to get hold of you or one of your emergency contacts. Please update us of any changes to these. Many thanks.

Visors

With cases on the rise nationally, and the measures put in place on gatherings this week, I am keen to do my very best to protect both staff and children working in this small school in close proximity. We have been so impressed with the children's response to the changes in routines, and children are washing hands or sanitizing every time they come in, after eating and after using the toilet. To add another level of protection for staff, I am asking them to wear visors from Monday INSIDE the school. We were kindly given some visors by Rich Ernest in the summer, which have fun designs on them (staff chose their design), and staff will be wearing these from Monday. We have explained the reasons to the children in worship today and shown them the visors so they know what to expect.
