Use of the school site outside of school hours

We need your help please. The bank and Forest School area are becoming eroded and damaged, due in part to heavy use by us this term but also because of use outside of school hours. We are going to restrict use of the bank over the winter in school time to allow some regeneration and improvements. The Forest School site will remain in use on Wednesdays and Fridays for the children here and pre-school children.
