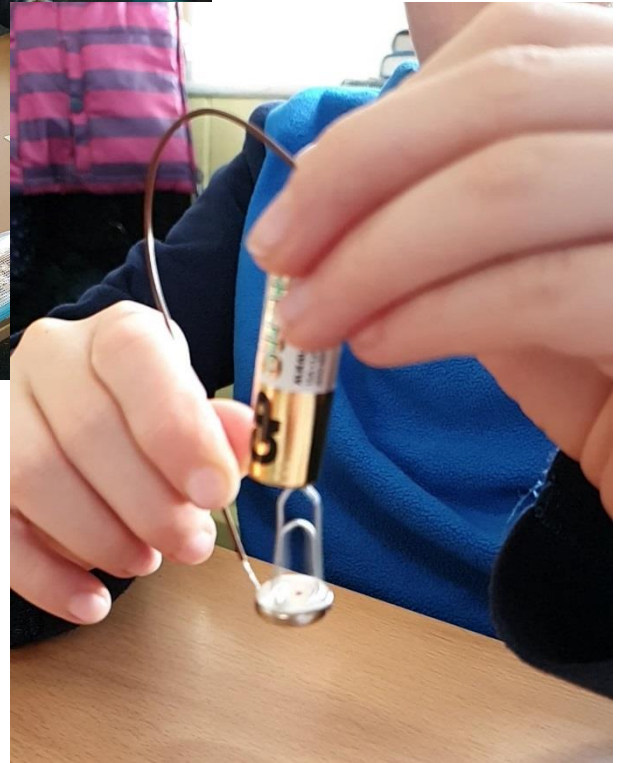
Kestrel class fun!

The Tailor of Gloucester was finding it hard to see his embroidery, so we carried out an investigation into the light in his workshop.

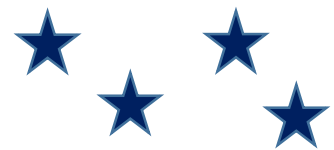


Sparrowhawks STEM workshop
