Dear Parents and Carers,

Following my previous message on the newsletter informing you that Mr Hinkley was unwell, I'm now writing to let you know that unfortunately he is still not well enough to return to school before the end of this term. We wish him well and hope he feels better soon however I know that parents will be concerned around the leadership of the school during this period.

Up until this point, Mr Hodgkinson and Mrs Donaldson have been doing a fantastic job of managing the day to day running of the school and this will continue. They have both agreed to 'step up' and lead the school, sharing responsibilities between them. Mrs Donaldson has also agreed to be in school full time up until the end of term.

The school is part of a local hub of schools where expertise is shared, and joint working already happens. This allows for a wealth of support and knowledge from other Heads and schools local to Randwick. We have also increased our support from the School Improvement Partner, Huw Evans, who is also able to offer advice and support where needed.

As you know, the intention was always to re-advertise this year for a new, substantive Headteacher for Randwick and this advert will go live again at the end of this term.

The year 5/6 teaching position is currently being advertised on the GCC website with a view to recruiting a full time, permanent teacher to start after the Easter break. This is the earliest opportunity we can hope to employ an established teacher due to the rules surrounding notice periods, although candidates who are not currently in a teaching position may be able to start sooner. We are committed to having a qualified teacher with the class at all times and we will employ a temporary class teacher via an agency from January until April.

The teaching assistant post for Buzzards has also been advertised and will be re-advertised again shortly. We have been lucky enough that Mrs Smith has been able to stay for longer than originally planned and for the 3 last weeks of term, Mrs Chastney's daughter will be coming in to support Miss Aldous.

The Governors would also like to take this opportunity to thank all the staff at the school, who have been working tirelessly to ensure smooth running of the school and stability for the children.

We'd also like to thank you the parents, for your patience and understanding and we are hoping to arrange an opportunity where Governors will be available to listen and answer any questions in the coming weeks.










Forest School
